TOEFL Test (iBT)

The 'Test of English as a Foreign Language' TOEFL is required for admission to almost every university in the USA, UK, Australia, New Zealand and Canada (though IELTS from Cambridge University is mostly reguired for Universities in the UK). For further information see www.toefl.org.

In most countries the TOEFL is now internet based (iBT) but in some counties it is still computer based (cBT) or even paper based. The TOEFL is designed and administered by a US based company called ETS (Educational Testing Services) from Princeton University.

Each university requires a minimum score in the TOEFL from applicants between 0 and 120. Details are found on the websites of each university and mostly quote the iBT or cBT score.

Content

All four language skills speaking, listening, reading and writing are tested. The test lasts about 3.5 – 4.5 hours. Note taking is allowed throughout the entire test. It is possible to go back to the previous question in the **Reading** section, but **NOT** in the **Listening** section.
